### Lesson 85 - Manners Matter

#### 1) Introduction

Today we will learn about manners. What are manners? It is about the right way to behave towards other people. For example, if you want more bread when eating together, you should say, "Please may I have another piece of bread?" When you receive the bread you should say, "Thank you." Every day we use lots of words. Some words are very important. Please and thank you are very important words

Sometimes we can show good manners without using words. For example, what should you do if your mummy and daddy are talking together and you want to ask them something? You could stand and wait patiently. You could gently put your hand on your mummy's shoulder, so she knows you want to speak. You could come back later. What is the wrong way to ask? Don't wait, just Interrupt them. Today's story is about a bear family and how they learn good manners

#### 2) The Berenstain Bears Say Please and Thank You

There wasn't a lot of fun in the Bear family, because they had forgotten their manners. There was a lot of squabbling and instead of using words like please and thank you, they were saying oh, yeah and phooey. One day Gran came to visit and brought a gift, an embroidery in a frame with the words MANNERS MATTER Her visit reminded the family the importance of their manners. From that day on they started again to say please and thank you. And once again it became a fun-filled bear family.

#### 3) Discussion

- \* What fun things did the Bear family like doing together? going places, doing things together and doing nothing together
- \* What was the problem with the Bear family? *They weren't having fun anymore. They were squabbling a lot and they were using words like oh yeah and phooey*
- \* What words had they forgotten? please, thank you
- \* Which animals noticed there was a lot of noise in the Bear family? bluebirds, pet goldfish, Mrs. Squirrel, Mr. Bunny and Mrs. Frog.
- \* Who visited one day? Gran
- \* What did Gran say when she arrived? THANK YOU
  SORRY about shouting EXCUSE ME for interrupting.
  Would you PLEASE accept the gift?"

\* How did Gran help? - She a brought a gift of embroidery with the words MANNERS MATTER.

\* What did the members of the family say when Gran gave the gift? THANK YOU (Papa)
PLEASE sit down,(Sister)
SORRY about not coming to the door more quickly, (Brother)
EXCUSE ME while I make a pot of tea (Mama)

\* What happened to the Bear family from that day on? - *They remembered their manners and started saying please and thank you again. They started having a lot of fun going places together, doing things together and doing nothing together* 

#### 4) Activities

- \* <u>Retell the story</u> in your own words using the pictures.
- \* <u>Make a framed picture</u> Cut out picture of the bear family and polite words. Paste them onto a cardboard picture frame. Attach string and display it on the wall at home
- \* <u>Colour a picture</u> of Mama Bear, brother and sister. Cut and paste the speech bubbles (Can I have a lollipop please ? Thank you)
- \* <u>Role play good manners</u> E.g. Having a meal together.

"THANK YOU for making a nice meal!" "Could you pass the ketchup, PLEASE?" SORRY what did you say you wanted?" "EXCUSE ME, I need the toilet.?
