Lesson 89 - Forgetful Ben

Aims

To learn that taking care of things is important
To learn that when children listen to parents they learn good habits

- * Picture cards of good and bad habits
- * Story Forgetful Ben
- * Objects for the story Bill and Ben cut-outs, socks, a toothbrush, coloured pencils, teddy bear
- * Objects for craft activity shoe boxes, stickers to decorate the boxes, name labels, glue scissors

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1) Introduction

- *Show good and bad pictures to do with taking care of things at home. Discuss the pictures. Ask what is the right and wrong thing to do. Which one does each child do?
- putting clothes away carefully
- putting toys away
- washing hands after going to the toilet
- taking bath clothes away
- wiping shoes before entering the house
- taking dirty dishes away
- * Do you forget to do them? Today's story is about a boy who was very forgetful

2) Story & Discussion

As you read the story use the Ben and Bill cut-outs, socks, toothbrush and teddy bear. If necessary, add extra objects that Ben might lose, such as a cup, pyjamas and coloured pencils

- * Which things couldn't Ben find? red socks, green toothbrush, teddy bear
- * Why did Ben cry? He was very sad. He lost his teddy bear, his favourite thing in the whole world.
- * What did he do next? He prayed.
- * What did he promise God? to put things where they belong and listen to his mummy
- * What did Ben's mum do to help him? make a box for his special things
- * Are you like Ben or Bill?

- * Do you forget to do things sometimes, like putting your toys away?
- * How do you feel when you can't find something that you want?
- * Do you listen to your mummy and daddy when they ask you take care of things?
- * Why is it important to take care of things?
- * What can you learn from the story?

4) Activites


- * Children make their own box to keep special things. They stick their name on top and coloured pictures on the sides. Children take home their boxes to keep special things in

6) Prayer

MUMMY: This is what you need Ben. I've got another box for you, where you can keep special toys. Come, let's decorate it!


From then on, He tried very hard to listen to what his mother said. His box reminded him to put special things there. And he always knew where to find them.





