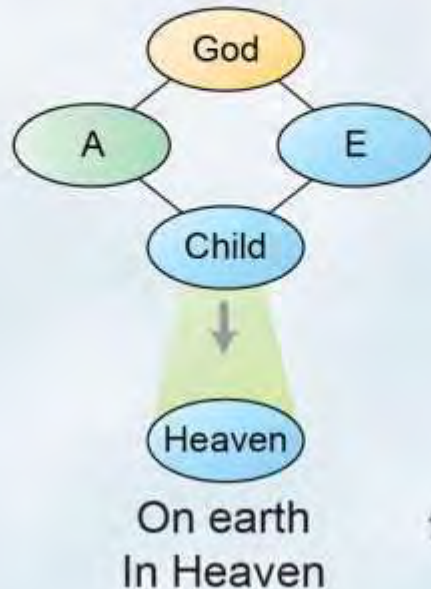

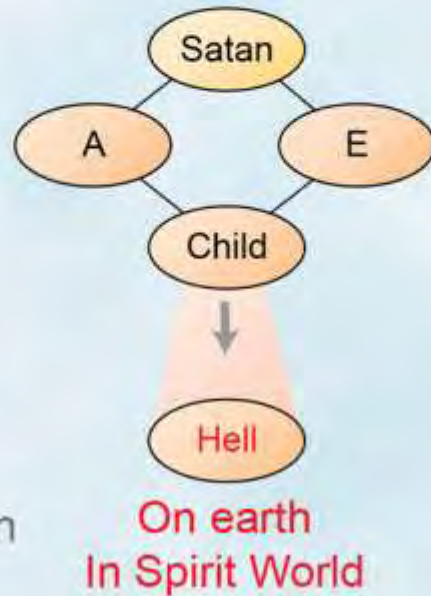
# The Purpose of Jesus' Coming

Bring Salvation by Restoring the World, bringing it out of Satan's Dominion and into God's Dominion.



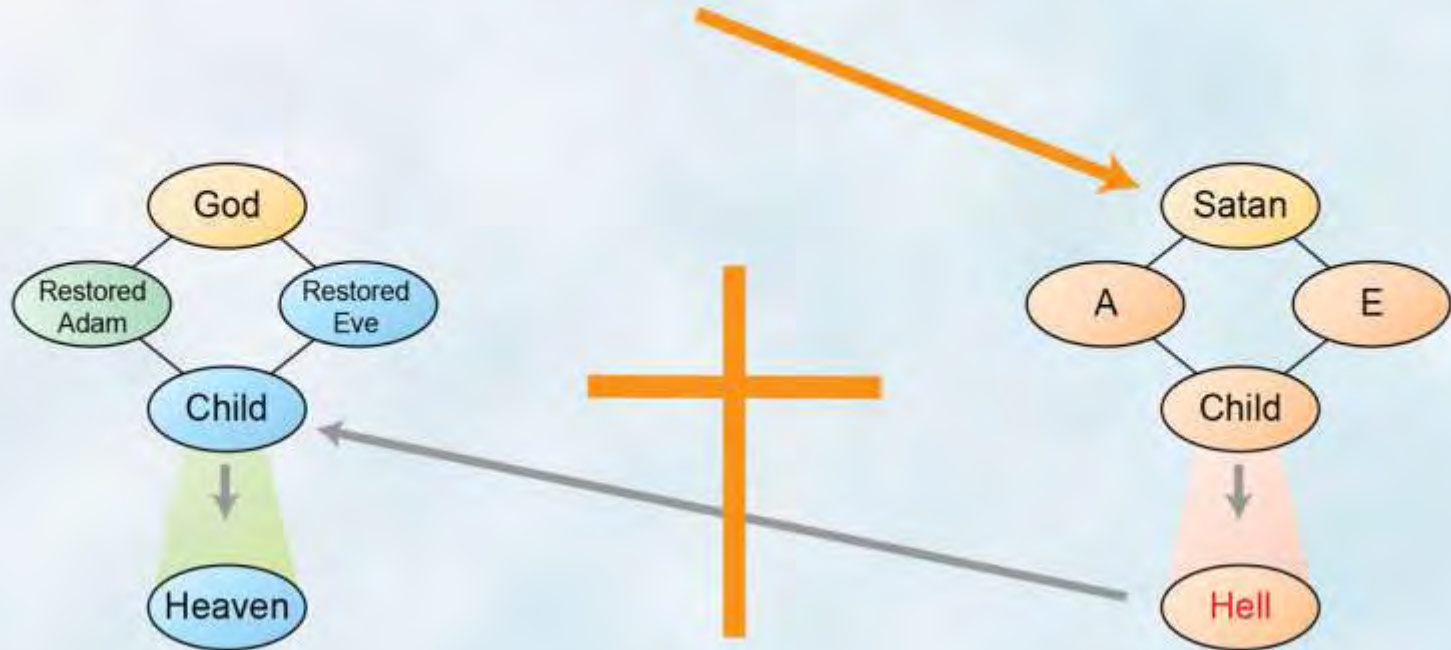

# Salvation through the cross

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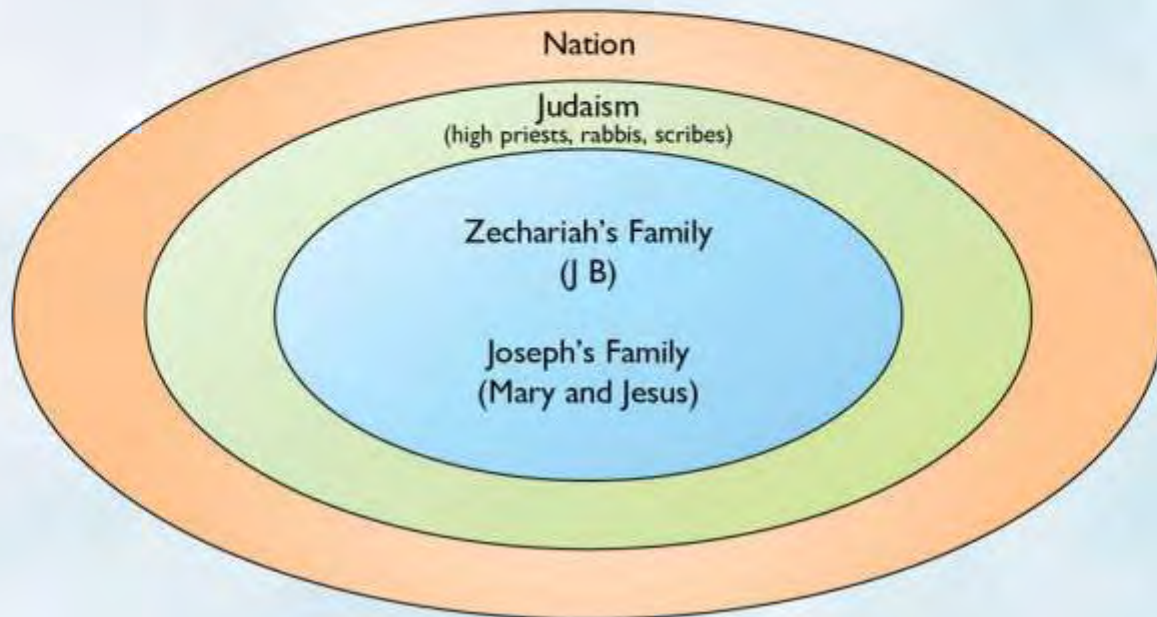
If Adam and Eve had obeyed God's commandment,  
God's family would have been realized.

They disobeyed and Satan became the false father.

John 8:44

If the people had **believed** Jesus, the restoration and recreation of God's family would have been completed. They **disbelieved** and he forgave and redeemed them, and us, through the cross.

## Was Jesus' path to the cross the only possibility?

- It was against God's providence
- It was against Jesus' words

When we look at Jesus' words,  
we see that he wanted to be believed in and accepted.  
Jesus testified that **God's will was that Israel believe in Jesus.**

## Why did Jesus pray “**Let this cup pass**”?

- sorrowful to death — they were rejecting God
- did not pray from human weakness
- God's original plan was that he would end all sin and evil and build the Kingdom of God

It was God's Will that he be accepted,  
but when the disciples slept and there was  
**no faith** in the people, he was **betrayed**  
into the hands of sinners.



## The first martyr's testimony

“

Ye stiff necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears,  
ye do always resist the Holy Ghost: as your fathers did, so do ye.  
Which of the prophets have not your fathers persecuted?  
and they have slain them which shewed before of the coming  
of the Just One; of whom ye have been now the betrayers

## Completion of the Providence of Salvation

What are perfect people like?

- Fully attuned to God
- Possess a divine nature
- Have no original sin
- No need of redemption
- No need for religious ritual
- Have good and sinless children

## Was this providence completed?

- Original sin is passed on to the children of the saved—all generations are in need of baptism
- Sin still exists in the saved. The Apostle Paul wrote as a saved Christian that his body served the law of sin. Romans 7:21-25
- We await the redemption of our body. Romans 8:23
- Though we are saved, **we still have sin.** John 1:8-10

Is there another redemption?

The **redemption of the body is yet to come.**

Romans 8:23



When Jesus returns, the ultimate purpose of the providence of salvation will be fulfilled. He returns to **complete God's work** and save those who are waiting for him with a salvation waiting to be revealed in the last times. [Heb 9:28](#), [1 Pet 1:5](#)

So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many;  
and unto them that look for him shall he appear the  
second time without sin unto salvation.

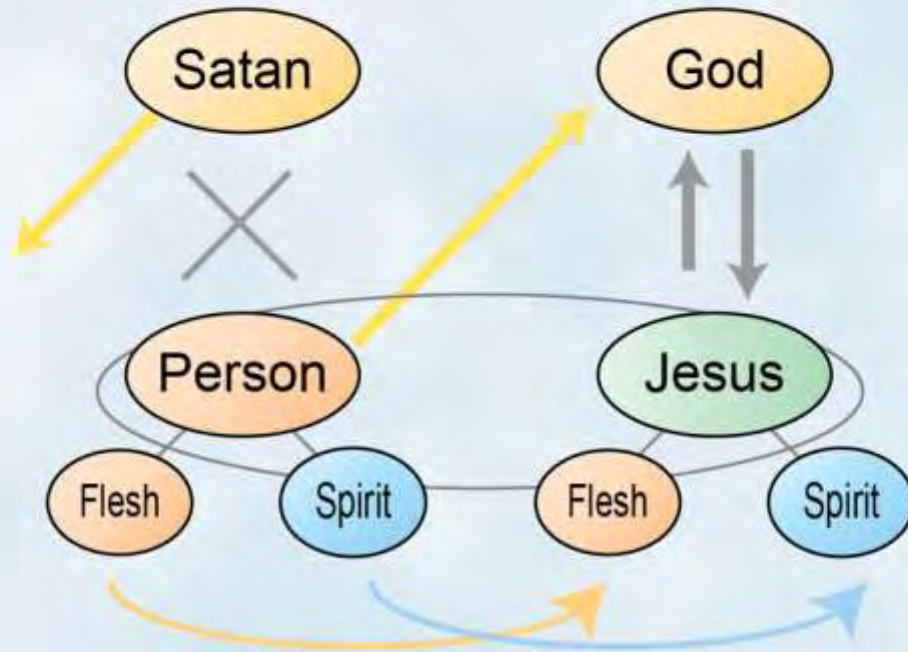
From this evidence, the ultimate purpose  
to end all sin and bring all into the Kingdom  
was not fulfilled.

That is why Jesus said **he will come again**.  
He will return to wipe away every tear and  
bring evil to an end.

Why was the ultimate purpose not fulfilled?

Because **the people** to whom God sent the Messiah **did not recognize that Jesus was the Christ**, the one they were waiting for.

The outcome depended upon faith in Jesus.

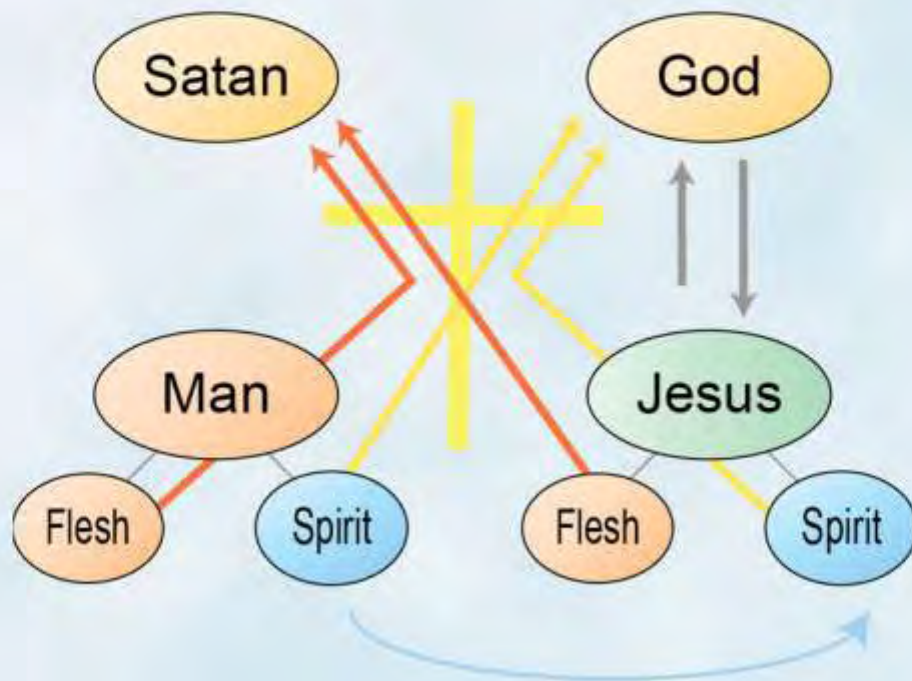




**The outcome depended

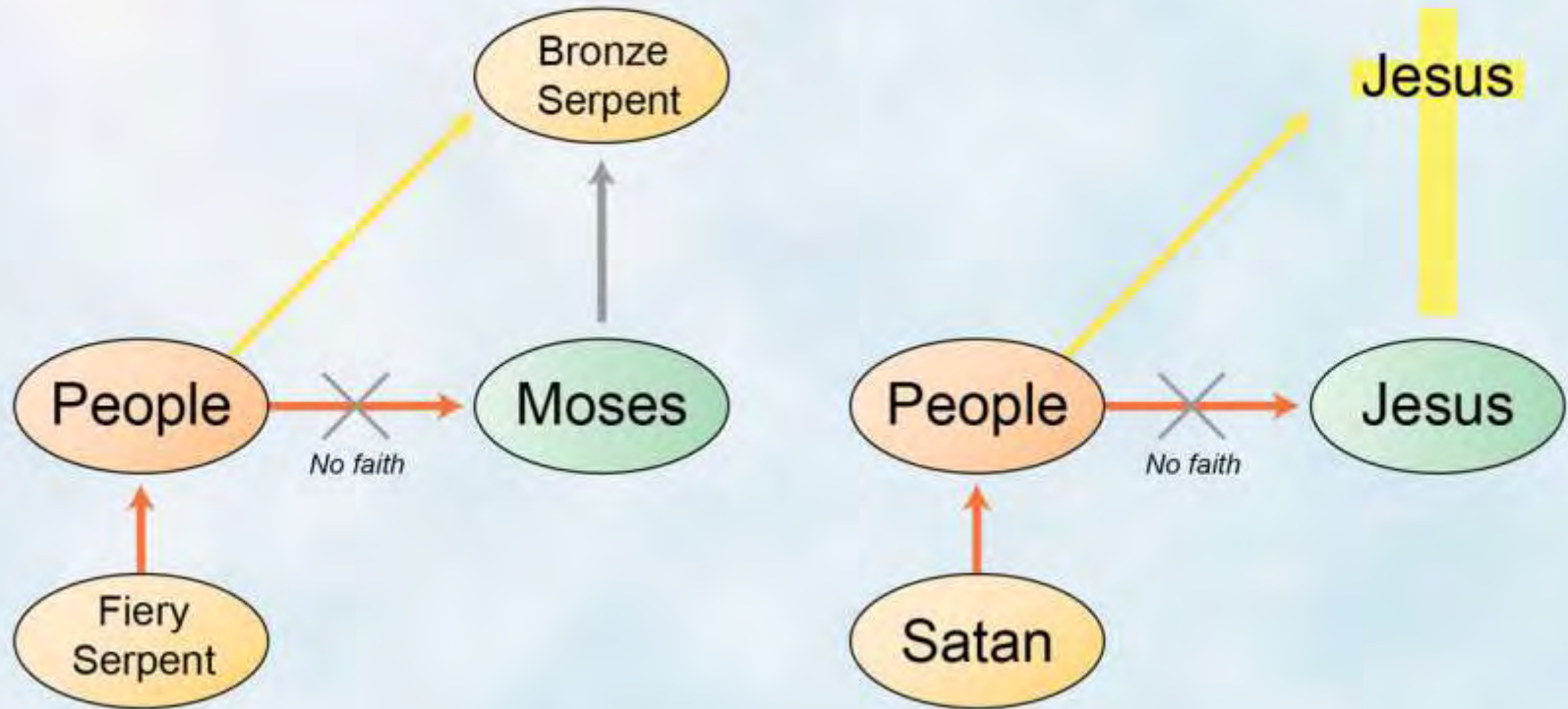

- Ascetic life
- Messianic status  
Jn 1:20, Lk 3:15

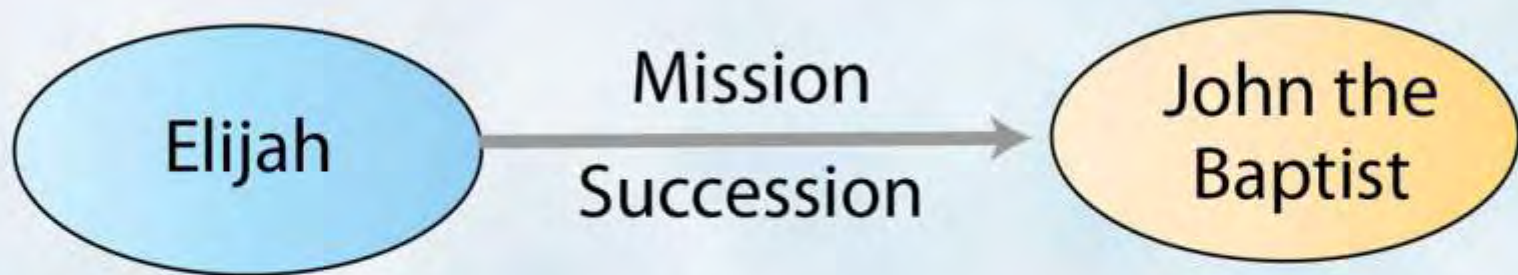
## JESUS

- Carpenter's family
- Unlearned youth
- Broke Sabbath Mt 12:1-8
- Friend of tax-collectors, prostitutes and sinners
- Claimed to be from Heaven
- Told people to love him more than their parents

The people followed John, and this made them  
doubt Jesus' words, not just about John,  
but about everything he said and did.

Jesus seemed to be just another man  
claiming to be the Messiah.

## The mission of John the Baptist





“

Make straight the way of the Lord.

Jn 1:23

... go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah ...  
make ready a people...and he will go before him  
in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts  
of the fathers to the children, and the disobedient to  
the wisdom of the just, to make ready for the Lord  
a people prepared.

Luke 1:17

## The mission of John the Baptist

- Luke 1:17 Zechariah's prophecy
- Not reincarnation - shared mission
- Biblical meaning of a second coming
- Testimony PLUS deeds were necessary
- Jesus said John WAS Elijah
- John **denied** he was Elijah. Why?

## The disbelief of John the Baptist Matthew 11:1-12

- Ignorant of God's Will and Providence
- Failed to inherit Jesus' vision and spirit
- Didn't understand Jesus' words and deeds
- Worried about his authority and reputation
- Had a **conventional expectation** of the Messiah

## A new perspective on the Bible

- We have been reading the Bible through an old lens, based on a “given” that John the Baptist fulfilled God’s will as a great prophet.
- We should examine our inherited attitude of faith—our old wineskins.
- We should constantly make effort to stand in the light of faith by **searching in both spirit and truth.**

## New light from scripture

- Rev. Moon's understanding came from Jesus
- Jesus revealed John's true mission and the meaning of the second advent
- Let us **open our hearts in prayer**, so God can guide our lives
